Constructed on a 2,500 square meter site donated by the Provincial Government of Tarlac thru Sangguniang Panlalawigan Resolution no. 159-97, "Granting authority to the Provincial Governor to enter, for and in behalf of the province of Tarlac into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) for the establishment of a Training Center in the Province of Tarlac and Deed of Usufruct executed on July 14, 2015 for 25 years.

In addition, Pursuant to Sangguniang Panlalawigan Resolution No. 012-2021, the Provincial Government of Tarlac has allocated a portion of parcel of land containing an aggregate area of two thousand (2,000) square meters to be occupied by the Usufructuary. The requested additional two thousand (2,000) square meters of lot purposively for the establishment of agriculture and construction-related training facilities.
